






The SAF supply chain can be complex and requires a robust traceability framework to facilitate SAF certification, accounting, and reporting.






Additionally, multiple GHG frameworks exist along the SAF supply value chain with slightly different requirements that may have some interplay with one another.





The flows of sustainability documentation need to follow these framework's requirements



Also, different SAF sustainability documentation exist. Question – what should airlines use to claim SAF?

Proof of Sustainability (PoS)

A delivery document issued by a producer/ supplier/ trader certified under a relevant certification scheme containing sustainability information on the sustainable material

Proof of Conformance/ Compliance (PoC)

A delivery document issued by a fuel supplier certified under relevant certification scheme* containing sustainability information on the sustainable material, in a situation whereby the associated PoS document is required to be surrendered to the relevant regulatory authority.

Compliance ticket/excerpt

A document issued by the relevant regulatory authority or registry operator to prove compliance under the relevant regulatory framework, or to corroborate SAF transaction in a registry.

Product Transfer Document (PTD)

A delivery document that authenticates the transfer of ownership of the Sustainable Aviation Fuel from the Seller to the Buyer.

Voluntary SAF Certificates

A certificate issued by airlines to allow claiming of voluntary of Scope 3 by corporate customers and must be verified by an external, and independent 3rd party.

Note:

- At the time of writing of this presentation, PoC has yet to be implemented.
- In the case of claiming under a relevant regulatory framework, airlines need to verify that PTDs are acceptable for claiming the environmental attributes under specific regulatory schemes in a particular jurisdiction.



It's not just about the document but also the required verified supplementary data.

- As an example, for CORSIA, these are included in the ICAO Annex 16, Vol IV document, Standards and Recommended Practices – CORSIA
 - Table A5-2 Supplementary information to an aeroplane operator's Emissions Report if emissions reductions from the use of each CORSIA eligible fuel being claimed
 - Table A5-6 CORSIA eligible fuels supplementary information to the Emissions Report from a State to ICAO

Examples of data required:

- Aircraft Operator's information
- Purchase date of CEF
- Batch ID
- Fuel production information
- Fuel type information
- Fuel purchased information
- Valid sustainability documentation
- LCA, mass, blend ratio values of CEF
- CEF supply value chain information



SAF may be used for multiple compliance purposes. Understanding what certification schemes the airlines require is an important decision to make when airlines purchase SAF

| Scheme Provider | SAF Certification Scheme* | | |

One batch of SAF may fulfill sustainability requirements of multiple GHG frameworks, i.e., CORSIA and EU RED. "Dual conformance" could provide flexibility in claiming SAF attributes.





