ISCC CANADA CFR - LIST OF SYSTEM DOCUMENTS

The ISCC Canada CFR system is designed to align with internationally recognised sustainability certification practices. Instead of creating a separate set of rules, it uses the ISCC PLUS certification system as its foundation. This ensures consistency, avoids duplication, and allows companies to work within a familiar framework while meeting the specific requirements of Canada's Clean Fuel Regulations (CFR).

In practice, this means that any company applying for ISCC Canada CFR certification must also follow the ISCC PLUS requirements and certain ISCC EU System Documents. While ISCC PLUS has recently introduced a new set of standalone documents with an 18-month transition period, these do not currently apply to the ISCC Canada CFR system. Since the system's recognition took place earlier this year—before the new documents were released—it continues to use the previous versions of the ISCC PLUS documents. Maintaining these original documents ensures clarity and consistency during the transition period.

The following list shows all the ISCC Documents that apply to the ISCC Canada CFR system, along with the applicable version of each document. The most recent version of this list can always be found on the official ISCC website.

System Document	Version	Description
ISCC EU 102 – Governance	4.1	Provides the general principles according to which the ISCC is governed globally. It specifies the goal and internal structure of ISCC, as well as the relationship between ISCC and its stakeholders, non-conformities and sanctions, ISCC Integrity Programme, and conflict resolution.
ISCC EU 103 – Requirements for Certification Bodies and Auditors	4.0	Defines the criteria that Certification Bodies (CBs) must meet to become recognised by ISCC. Details the responsibilities of ISCC-recognised CBs in delivering certification services and specifies the required qualifications and competencies for auditors conducting ISCC audits.
ISCC EU 201 – System Basics	4.1	Describes the general ISCC registration and certification requirements, as well as the step-by-step certification process.
ISCC PLUS	3.4.2	Special focus should be given to the general traceability and documentation requirements, as well as the specific provisions for Farms/Plantations, Central Offices managing Farms/Plantations, and First Gathering Points. Also includes the requirements for Group Certification.

ISCC EU 202-1– Agricultural Biomass: ISCC Principle 1	4.1	Defines the requirements under ISCC Principle 1 for biomass cultivated and produced in agriculture, intended for the production of biofuels, bioliquids, and biomass fuels.
ISCC EU 202-2 – Agricultural Biomass: ISCC Principles 2-6	1.1	Defines the requirements under ISCC Principles 2–6, covering social, ecological, and economic criteria for agricultural biomass used in the production of biofuels, bioliquids, and biomass fuels.
ISCC EU 202-4 – Forest Biomass: ISCC Principle 1	1.0	Defines the requirements under ISCC Principle 1 for biomass cultivated and produced in forestry, intended for the production of biofuels, bioliquids, and biomass fuels.
ISCC EU 202-4 – Forest Biomass: ISCC Principles 2-6	1.0	Defines the requirements under ISCC Principles 2–6, covering social, ecological, and economic criteria for forest biomass used in the production of biofuels, bioliquids, and biomass fuels.
ISCC EU 204 – Risk Management	4.1	Explains how the ISCC risk management process is applied to all ISCC activities and how identified risks affect ISCC audits.
ISCC 208 – Logos and Claims	1.3	Provides rules and guidance on the use and development of ISCC logos and claims to ensure consistency, credibility, and transparency. Supports organisations in communicating their sourcing of alternative materials effectively.
ISCC Canada CFR	1.0	Adds Land Use and Biodiversity criteria specific to the CFR requirements and specifies additional auditor requirements that CBs must follow.
